


#### Journal Entry - 3/22:


### Journal Entry - 3/24:

We live in the 21st century, in America, with running water, electricity and refrigerators! Can I get an amen! In the time when Jesus was alive, you couldn't just turn on a light switch for light, instead, you had to place oil under a lamp. This oil would burn and act as a catalyst to keep the fire burning and the "lights on," if you will. Honestly, my grandmother used to have the most beautiful oil lamps, which she would never allow me to touch, because I would have broken the glass into pieces!

The oil of the Holy Spirit acts as the oil in these lamps! It is because of the oil that the lamp is able to hold a flame, much like the Holy Spirit's ability to illuminate to us the Word of God. As we read, as we study, as we delve deeper into the Word of God, we are free to see the work of the Holy Spirit in every aspect of who God is and the work that He is doing! Psalm 119:105 reads, "Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path." This light is the word of God, illuminated by the Holy Spirit. The Bible states that all scripture is "God-breathed." The men that wrote these words were writing inspired by the power of the Holy Spirit! When we read the words, that same Holy Spirit helps to illuminate in us divine understanding! 
#### Journal Entry - 3/26:

To be anointed with the Holy Spirit is to be forever changed. In our fleshly desires, it can get ugly. We can be easily irritated, lash out, become extremely impatient or even hostile. Living with the Holy Spirit is to live called to a greater purpose and more powerful life. For example, as we are living anointed by the Holy Spirit, there will be solid, concrete evidence! These evidence can be seen in the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness & self-control.

The Holy Spirit operating as the symbol of oil allows us to see clearly illuminated evidence of how we can act on these fruits in our lives. Not only that, but through the symbol of oil, we can find healing to reconcile who we are right now to who we want to become, in Jesus name. The evidence of the Holy Spirit alive in our lives comes from the fruits of the Spirit. We must examine our hearts, search deep into our soul and ask the Holy Spirit to help us see what we can't see. That is the power in the symbol of oil - He can bring light to our darkness. As we search the innermost workings of our motives, our thoughts, our hopes and our fears the Holy Spirit can help us to see clearly. We can begin to operate in the fruit of the Holy Spirit because we are living in expectation that He who began a good work in us - will see it through! He is for us!

## Respond:

Take a moment to reflect on the fruits of the spirit found in Galatians 5:22-23. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to speak to you about which fruits need purifying and ask for His help. Ask that He help to transform your thinking. Open your hands in expectation.
